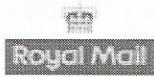

1 Finding legal help

1.1 Authorised solicitors

2 Legal aid

If an individual needs help to pay for legal advice or proceedings they may be eligible for assistance from the Government through the Legal aid scheme. Legal aid is available for both civil and criminal matters. The rules for civil legal aid recently changed on 1 April 2013.

Generally, the case will need to be within scope of the legal aid scheme and the individual will need to show that they can't afford to pay. In some cases, individuals may be required to make a contribution to their legal aid costs.

4 Paying for legal advice

4.1 Fixed fee interview

Some solicitors offer a set period (often half an hour) of legal advice free or at a fixed rate. The Law Society database states which solicitors offer fixed fee interviews.¹³

4.2 “No win, no fee” agreements

There are two types of "no win no fee" agreements which can be used to fund certain types of civil cases; *Conditional fee agreements* (CFAs), and *Damages-based agreements* (DBAs).

Further information about CFAs and DBAs, including what happens if your claim is successful, or if you lose your claim, is provided on the website of the Solicitors Regulation Authority; *Costs and Legal Aid*.¹⁴

It is important to note that there may be some risks for claimants whatever the outcome of the case. A solicitor should be able to properly explain all available funding options and possible costs before you decide whether or not to instruct them.

4.3 Legal expenses insurance

Legal expenses insurance can cover the cost of some legal proceedings. Motor insurance policies and household contents insurance sometimes have legal expenses insurance attached to them. Individuals would need to check the terms of their own policies to see the extent of their insurance cover.

5 Advice for specific issues

There are also a number of organisations which provide help and advice for specific issues.

5.1 Rights of women

The charity, *Rights of Women*, provide free and confidential legal advice to women on issues such as family law, criminal law and immigration. (020 7251 6577).¹⁵

Small claims are lower value civil claims dealt with by county courts. The small claims track is intended to provide a simple way of resolving disputes. Typical small claims include claims for faulty services provided, for example, by builders, dry cleaners etc, or for faulty goods such as washing machines, televisions etc, or for unpaid bills.
